













































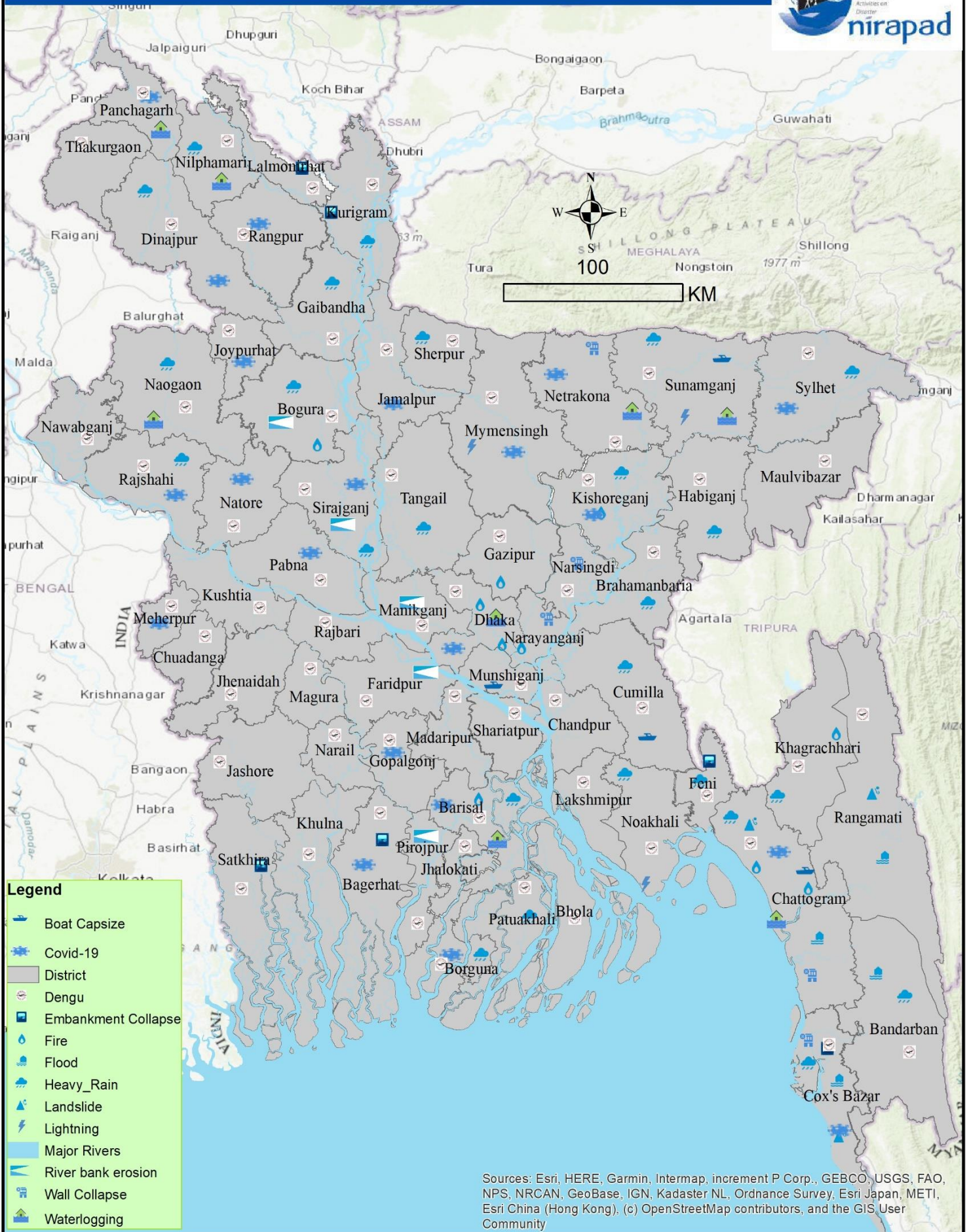
Overview of Hazard Incidences in August 2023

In August 2023, Bangladesh encountered a total of **13** different hazard incidents which included **Boat Capsize, COVID-19, Dengue, Embankment Collapse, Fire Incident, Flood, Heatwave, Heavy Rainfall, Landslide, Lightning, Riverbank Erosion, Wall Collapse and Water Logging**. In August, there was a significant increase in the number of confirmed dengue cases and deaths compared to July. According to the daily situation report from [DGHS](#) (Directorate General of Health Services) the outbreak impacted all the districts of Bangladesh and **71,976** confirmed cases and **342** deaths reported in August. According to the daily hazard situation report [MoDMR](#) (332) and Daily Newspaper(17), a total of **349 Fire** incidents were recorded. "These incidents tragically resulted in **21** fatalities and **35** injuries. Additionally, property worth around 10 lac taka including furniture, crops, electronics and cash was damaged in the fire. Multiple **boat capsizes** incidents happened in various districts, caused **14** fatalities and **six** persons reported missing. A total of **nine landslides** were documented in August where **11** fatalities were reported. Additionally, it's worth noting that many incidents went unreported and were not published in national dailies. Between August 5th and August 10th, a devastating flood event occurred, resulting in significant damage and **seven** reported fatalities. These catastrophic floods have affected **36** Upazilas in **four** divisions (Chattogram, Cox's Bazar, Rangamati, and Bandarban) caused substantial damage to these regions. Furthermore, **five** incidents of wall collapse were taking place, as a result **five** fatalities and **five** injuries recorded. In August, there were **877** newly confirmed COVID-19 cases, with **four** reported deaths and **143** individuals recovering from the virus during the same period. According to the daily newspaper **three** lightning incidents are recorded which led to the death toll of **three** people and **two** injuries were recorded in different unions. Widespread heavy rainfall across several districts has led to issues like waterlogging, disruptions and increased flood risks. **Fourteen** riverbank erosion incidents were reported in **ten** districts affecting several divisions including Rajshahi, Barishal, Chattogram, Rangpur, and Barishal throughout the month of August. During the month of August, waterlogging was observed in **eight** different districts across the country, causing various degrees of disruption and inconvenience to the local residents. **One** tragically went missing after falling into a drain, and his body was later found nearby in Haliashahar, Chattogram. **Eight** incidents of embankment collapse were reported in **six** districts in August. During the month of August, Chuadanga recorded a maximum **temperature of 38.4 degrees Celsius**, indicating a high level of heat during that day. Notably, on the 13th of August, Sunamganj experienced an exceptionally high rainfall of **387 mm** in a single day.

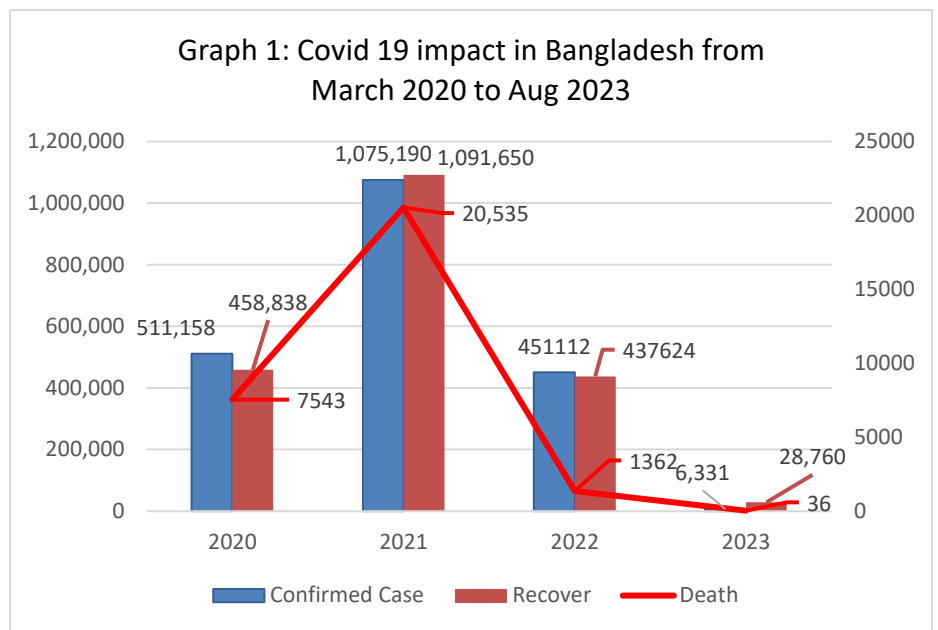

Description of Hazard Incidents in August 2023

Covid-19

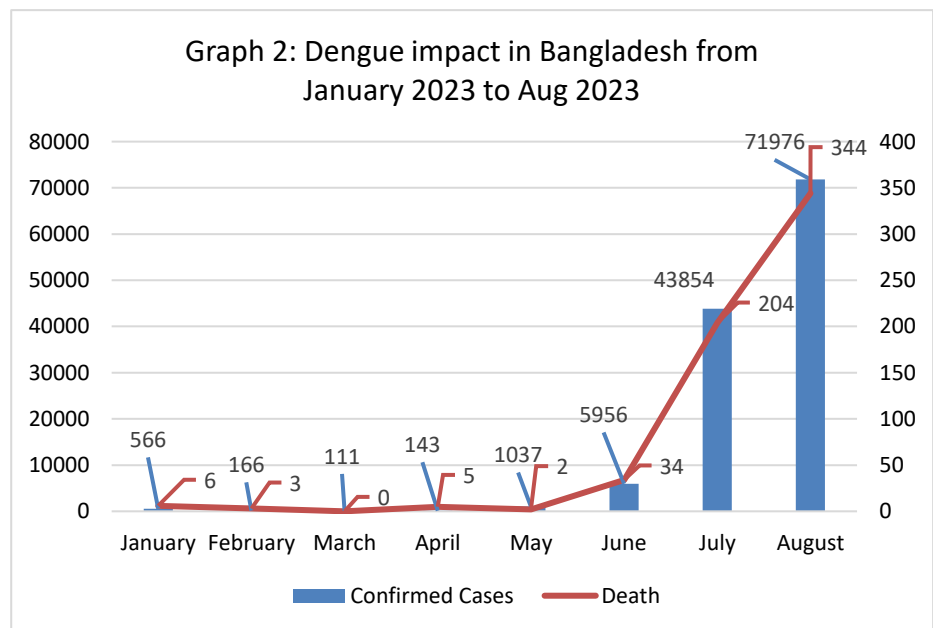
From 1st August to 31st August 2023, there were **877** newly identified patients with Covid-19. During this period, **143** people have recovered, and **4** reported deaths. This indicates a decrease in both the number of deaths and confirmed cases compared to the previous month.

As of the end of August, the total number of confirmed cases since the first identification of Covid-19 has reached **2,045,334**. The total number of deaths by the end of August was **29,477** and the total number of recovered cases was **2,012,832** in Bangladesh ([DGHS](#)). Dengue

Based on [DGHS](#) daily situation report, there was an increase in confirmed cases and deaths of dengue compared to the previous month. In August, all **64** districts of Bangladesh were affected by dengue, and **Dhaka** as usual recorded the highest number of confirmed cases (**29,572**) and deaths (**242**). There were **71,976** confirmed cases and **342** reported deaths in total throughout August. The map shows the spatial distribution of dengue confirmed cases in the month of August. Fire

According to the NDRCC daily hazard situation reports **332** fire incidents took place across the country in August 2023. Dhaka division reported the highest number of fire incidents (**103**), followed by Chattogram division (**70**), Rajshahi division (**41**), Mymensingh division (**34**), Khulna division (**29**), Rangpur division (**21**), Sylhet division (**17**), Barishal Division (**17**). Out of the **363** recorded incidents, **two** fatalities and **25** injuries were reported, along with significant property damage. The table shows the summarized incidents of fire that happened in August according to NDRCC.

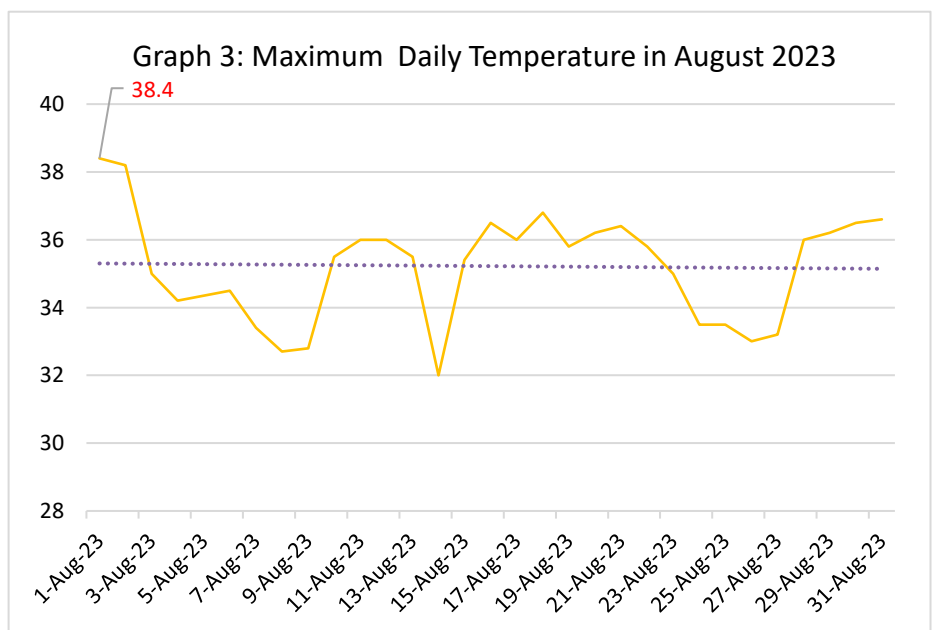

In August, a total of **17** fire incidents were reported in Bangladesh according to daily newspapers. On August 12, a tragic incident occurred resulting in the loss of two lives, while six individuals sustained burn injuries in Savar, Dhaka ([Prothom Alo](#)). On August 12, a distressing incident unfolded, resulting in the burning of four individuals and injuring two in Narayanganj Sadar. Moreover, the walls of a five-storey apartment building collapsed, causing damage to the furniture of a semi-furnished house nearby. The furniture within the apartment was also consumed by the fire ([Prothom Alo](#)). On August 13, a tragic incident occurred, leading to the burning of three individuals in Gazipur ([Prothom Alo](#)). On August 13, a distressing incident transpired where initially five individuals, including a child, suffered burn injuries, and unfortunately, two of them succumbed to their injuries in Dhaka. ([Prothom Alo](#)). On August 14, a tragic incident occurred in Keraniganj, resulting in the unfortunate demise of five individuals from the same family ([Prothom Alo](#)). Two individuals, including the owner of a gas storehouse, suffered burn injuries in Sitakunda ([Prothom Alo](#)) and three individuals lost their lives in Keraniganj, Dhaka on 15 August ([Prothom Alo](#)). A man tragically lost his life, and his wife sustained burn injuries on 28 August ([The Daily Star](#)). A total of 4 persons were burnt in an accident on 30 August in Dhaka ([Prothom Alo](#)). Heatwave

According to the National Disaster Response Coordination Center (NDRCC) report, the maximum temperature in August was recorded at **38.4 degrees Celsius** (mild heatwave) in Chuadanga, Khulna, signifying a significant heatwave event for that region. On 1st August a mild heatwave swept through Chattogram, Chandpur, Noakhali, Cumilla, and Feni. On August 2nd, a mild heatwave affected Dhaka, Tangail, Faridpur, Kishoreganj,

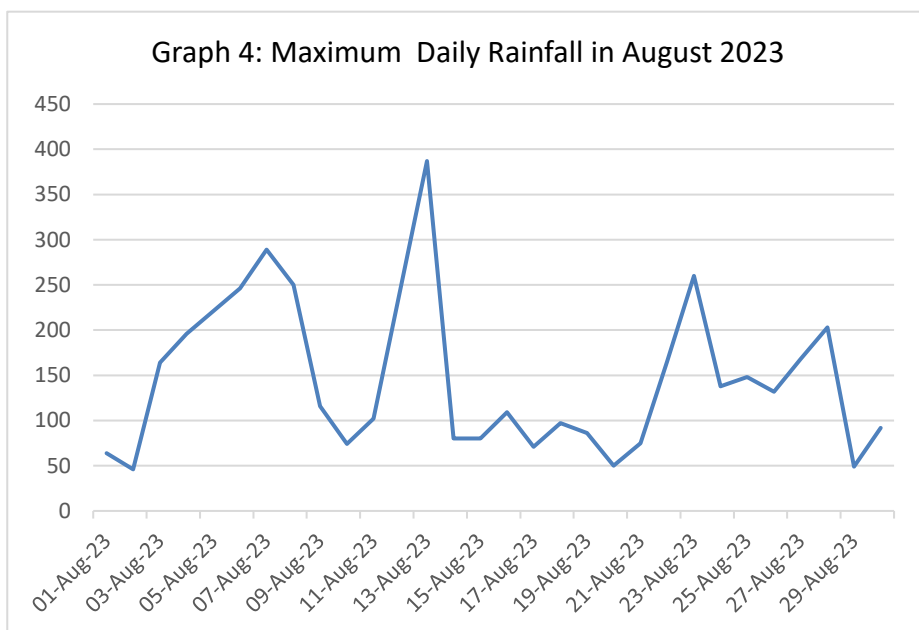


Manikganj, Chuadanga, and Kushtia districts. On August 30, a mild heatwave goes through Faridpur, Pabna, Sirajganj, Nilphamari districts. For more information, please refer to [Annex-4](#) and the table provided below.

Heavy Rainfall

During the month of August, Moheshkhola experienced an unprecedented amount of rainfall, with a record-breaking 387 mm of rainfall in a single day for that month. This was part of a broader weather pattern and climate change, with the entire country facing heavy rainfall throughout the month, average was more than 110 mm.

Unfortunately, the consequence of this excessive rainfalls were severe, leading to widespread flooding and waterlogging in various districts in Southern and Western region of Bangladesh



in various districts in Southern and Western region of Bangladesh ([Daily Situation Report](#)).

Wall Collapse

A total of 5 wall collapse occurred in August 2023. Among them, 1 laborer died in Kalmakanda upazila of Netrokona district in Mymensingh on 2 August ([bd-pratidin](#)). On the 6th August, 1 child died and 2 people were injured in Banskhali Upazila of Chattogram district ([prothomalo](#)). Just a day after that on 7th August, 2 children siblings were killed in the mud wall at Chakaria in Cox's Bazar ([bd-pratidin](#)). 3 persons were badly injured at Shibpur upazila of Narsingdi district on 10 August ([prothomalo](#)). Then on August 16, a village doctor died after a wall collapsed in Araihasar Upazila of Narayanganj ([samakal](#)). For more information, please refer to [Annex-5](#) and the table provided below.

Boat Capsize

In August, 4 incidents of boat capsizing occurred in different districts, which caused a total of 14 deaths with 5 people reported missing. 9 people died, and 1 child was missing after boat capsized after being hit by bulkhead at Louhajung upazila of Munshiganj district on 6 August ([prothomalo](#)). A businessman died in boat capsized which happened in a branch canal near Halda River in the border area of Raujan and Hathazari of Chattogram on 8 August ([prothomalo](#)). On 9 August, 4 people reported missing at Satkania upazila of Chattogram district because of a boat capsized ([thedailystar](#)). Two brothers and sisters died together after their boat sank in Dakatiya river at Chaudagram upazila of Cumilla District on 18 August ([samakal](#)). On August 27 one man was reported missing in Madhyanganj, Sunamganj ([prothomalo](#)) while in Tahirpur, Sylhet, two people lost their lives ([prothomalo](#)). Landslide

In August 2023, 9 landslides were reported in a total of 4 districts of Chattogram division. On 4 August, at Anwara upazila of Chattogram district, a mountain collapsed onto a moving microbus halted traffic in the Tigerpass area ([prothomalo](#)). No one was injured but traffic was blocked for several hours. A hill collapse occurred in Shahi Colony, a residential area for Chattogram University employees at Hathazari Upazila of Chattogram district ([prothomalo](#)) and four people died in a landslide at Ukhiya of Cox's Bazar ([prothomalo](#)) on 7 August. Two people died in landslides at Alikadam and Naikhongchhari in Bandarban. Apart from this, a woman died after a mud house collapsed in Kumari area of Lama upazila on 8 August ([prothomalo](#)). At the same day a landslide occurred in the two hill areas of Marishya-Dighinala road in Bangaltali union of Baghaichhari upazila of Rangamati. And Baghaichhari-Khagrachari road was closed due to landslides ([prothomalo](#)). The day after that on 9 August, 1 land collapse happened while cutting a hill in Beltoli area of Akbar Shah police station of Chattogram city. 1 death was confirmed and several other workers went

missing ([prothomalo](#)). An old man died in a landslide in Cox's Bazar Sadar upazila on 15 August ([bd-pratidin](#)). On 16 August, there were 278 small and medium landslides were occurred. 6 thousand 812 houses, 70 roads, 36 culverts and 3 thousand 417 hectares of crop land were damaged. Road damaged due to landslides, was around Taka 14 crores ([samakal](#)). A father and daughter died in a landslide in Sholshahar area of Chattogram city on 27 August ([prothomalo](#)). 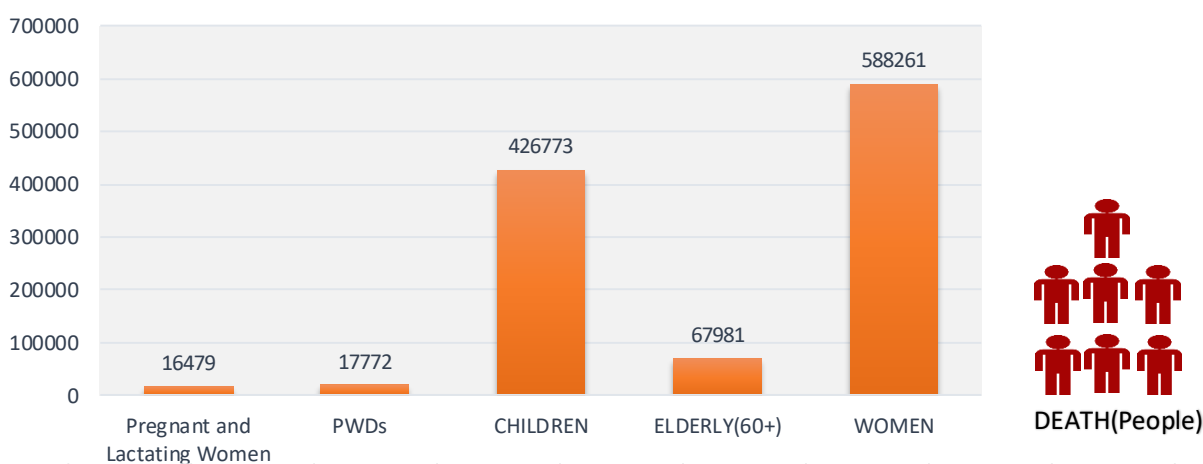
Embankment Collapse

In August 2023, eight incident of embankment collapse were reported across six districts. On 4 August at Teknaf upazila of Cox's Bazar Marine Drive road is damaged and 2000 people in the area were in hazard risk ([prothomalo](#)). 300 families of three villages trapped and fishes of 20-25 enclosures washed away at Bagerhat Sadar on 5 August ([dhakatribune](#)). About 100m of the 300m earthen flood control embankment along the Teestahas collapsed at Lalmonirhat district on 7 August ([thedailystar](#)). Rendering 250,000 people marooned and power connection was disrupted in 15 villages under the seven upazilas of Cox's Bazar district on 8 August ([dhakatribune](#)). On 27 August, Six villages of Feni district were flooded, aman paddy fields, vegetable gardens were submerged in the water ([prothomalo](#)). At the Pekua upazila of Cox's Bazar, embankment collapse has submerged the seed bed of the cropland and the aman field, water has risen in the yard of the people's houses in some areas ([prothomalo](#)). On 30 August, there are serious cracks and collapses in the dams of the Water Development Board at Assasuni upazila of Satkhira district ([prothomalo](#)) and lower areas of the Brahmaputra river basin have been inundated due to rising water. The crops of the land along the river were drowned and Cattle pastures have collapsed at Rajarhat of Kurigram district ([prothomalo](#)). Flood

The Chattogram division has been facing severe flash floods, which have left a significant number of residents without essential supplies like food, clean water, medicine, and electricity. These floods, worsened by heavy rainfall and increased water flow from upstream areas, have significantly affected over a million people During that period, seven fatalities were reported in Chattogram, Cox's Bazar, Rangamati, and Bandarban districts. Furthermore, the flash flood that emerged during the month (5th to the 10th of August) impacted approximately 34,973.5 hectares of cropland ([Needs Assessment Working Group](#)).

Riverbank Erosion

Fourteen riverbank erosion incidents were reported in a total of ten districts as indicated by newspaper reports on August 2023. At Shahjadpur, Enayetpur, Chauhali, Kazipur upazila of Sirajganj district over 100 households washed away by riverbank erosion ([banglatribune](#)). About 100 meters CC block area of Jamuna River right embankment conservation project has collapsed at Bogra on 6 August ([prothomalo](#)). 7 families

lost their households and 50 households under risk by the riverbank erosion of Bandarban district on 11 August ([prothomalo](#)). At least 150 households and business organizations got eroded away at Shahjadpur, Enayetpur, Chauhali Upazila of Sirajganj district on 16 August ([bd-pratidin](#)). At Harirampur of Manikganj district 24 families lost their households and one-third of the govt. primary school collapsed on 25 August 2023 ([prothomalo](#)). 1.5 km of land got eroded 200 bigha cultivable land and school buildings were under risk of collapsed at Alfadanga of Faridpur district on 27 August ([prothomalo](#)). On 31 August an area of about 20 meters collapsed at Sariakandi of Bogra district ([bd-pratidin](#)). For more information, please refer to [Annex-9](#) and the table provided below.

Waterlogging

In the month of August, waterlogging was reported in eight different districts. On the 6th of August, after three hours of rainfall in Comilla Nagar, Kadirpar Nazrul Avenue experienced water accumulation up to knee-deep levels ([prothomalo](#)). On the 7th of August, following half an hour of rainfall in Brahmanbaria, various areas within the district town had their roads inundated with water([prothomalo](#)). On that very same day, the shuttle train service, a mode of transportation used by Chittagong University students, was closed due to flooding([prothomalo](#)). On 8 August Roads, schools, colleges and playgrounds of Bogra city submerged in water due to continuous rain ([prothomalo](#)) and 90% submerged due to heavy rains and high tide in the Kirtankhola River ([prothomalo](#)). On August 9, heavy rain flooded roads in the capital, leading to significant traffic jams and hardship for commuters ([prothomalo](#)). A one-and-a-half-year-old child tragically went missing after falling into a drain, and his lifeless body was later found nearby in Chottogram's Haliashahar area ([bd-pratidin](#)). Additionally, it has been determined that the HSC and equivalent exams in 27 examination centers of Chottogram city will commence one hour later than the scheduled time on 27 August. Lightning

Three incidents of lightning strikes were documented, which regrettably led to the demise of three individuals and caused injuries to two others. On the 7th of August, a tragic incident involving lightning unfolded in the agricultural fields of Lakshmipur, Gaibandhapara. During this incident, one individual lost their life, and two others sustained injuries due to the lightning strike ([bd-pratidin](#)). On 9 August, 1 people fall into the water due to lightning and died at Mollapara Union of Shantiganj Upazila of Sunamganj district ([samakal](#)). A fourteen years old madrasah student was killed by lightning at Hatia Upazila of Noakhali district on 12 August ([inqilab](#)).

Government of Bangladesh's Response

Response to Flood

According to [NAWG](#) Situation Report During the flash flood in August, Cox's Bazar, Chattogram, and Bandarban districts each received an allocation of 100 metric tons of rice. Furthermore, a cash allocation of 10,000,000 Bangladeshi Taka (BDT) was apportioned to each district, resulting in an aggregate cash allocation of 30,000,000 BDT. Additionally, a total of 9,000 packs of dry food were evenly distributed among these districts, with each district receiving 3,000 packs. This allocation is intended to furnish these regions with essential food resources.

Response to Lightning

The upazila administration provided a cash donation of BDT 25,000 to the family of the lightning strike victim([bd-pratidin](#)).

Response to Riverbank Erosion

The Manikganj Water Development Board promptly employed a range of effective measures, including geo-tubes, geo bags and the dumping materials to protect the remaining portion of the school, demonstrating a swift and efficient response ([dhakatribune](#)). Temporary geo bags have been deployed to safeguard the Madhumati River banks, with future permanent measures encompassing a 7-kilometer preservation effort,

a 3.1-kilometer dredging operation and the placement of CC blocks at eight erosion-prone sites along a 7-kilometer riverbank section ([prothomalo](#)). The Bogra Water Development Board has initiated the deposition of geo-synthetic sand-filled bags in erosion-affected regions ([bd-pratidin](#)).

Conclusion

In the month of August 2023, Bangladesh faced several hazards and adverse events, and the report underscore the critical need for a robust disaster management strategy to mitigate the impact of adverse events. This underscores the need for an integrated and proactive approach to disaster risk reduction. Collaborative efforts among stakeholders and the Government of Bangladesh should prioritize anticipatory preparedness program, technology based early warning systems to mitigate the impact of various hazards and safeguard lives and properties.
