



Overview of Hazard Incidences in November 2023

In November 2023, **six** hazard incidents occurred across Bangladesh, including, **Boat Capsize, Covid-19, Dengue, Fire, Wall collapse, and Cyclone**. Based on the [DGHS](#) daily situation report, the confirmed cases and deaths of **Dengue** decreased in November compared with October. This month it spread across all of the 64 Districts of Bangladesh and the total confirmed cases were **36,853** identified and the total death was **277** in November. Concerning the daily hazard situation report of [MoDMR](#) and [DDM](#), **676** fire incidents occurred, where **one** person killed, **Eight** people were injured, **10** shops and several property damages were recorded. The number of newly identified patients with **Covid-19** was **146** in November 2023—fortunately, no deaths were recorded in this month due to Covid-19.

In November, heavy rain triggered the collapse of a mud wall in Teknaf, Cox's Bazar, claiming the lives of a mother and her three children. This tragedy highlighted the vulnerability of communities to hazards, emphasizing the urgent need for preventive measures. On 17 November, Cyclone **Midhili** landed near Kuakata City, bringing sustained winds of **70** km/h and a storm surge of 1.6 meters. The cyclone resulted in extensive damage along coastal areas, including seven reported deaths and numerous fishermen missing. Heavy rain caused widespread flooding, affecting 13 districts and disrupting the lives of around **150,000** people. Agricultural sectors suffered significant losses, highlighting the economic toll of natural disasters.

On 19 November 2023, a boat was capsized in the Bay of Bengal. Fourteen fishermen initially reported missing. Later, the Bangladesh Navy conducted a rescue operation on November 16th, saving **14** fishermen whose boat had capsized in the Bay of Bengal due to engine failure. This incident underscored the difficult conditions faced by those reliant on the sea for their livelihoods and the crucial role of timely rescue operations in mitigating loss of life.

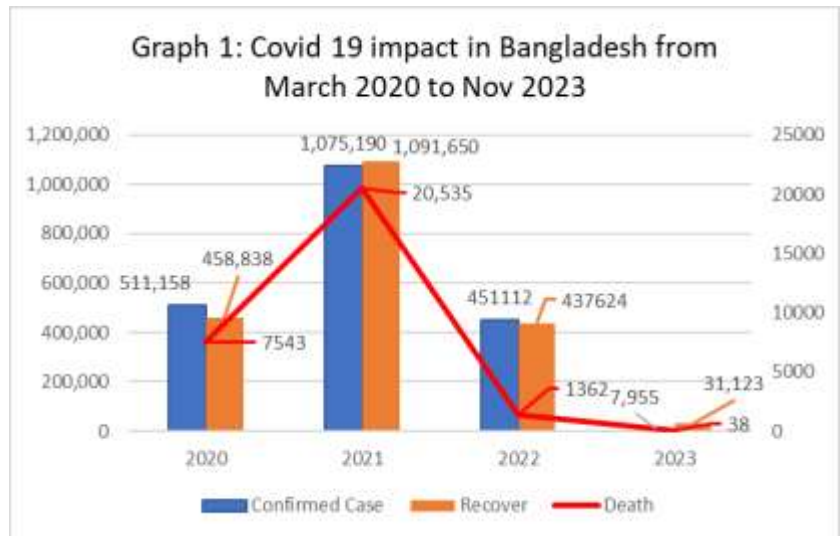
Hazard Incidence in Bangladesh, November 2023



Description of Hazard Incidences in October 2023

Covid-19

The number of newly identified patients with Covid-19 was **146** from November 1st to November 30th, 2023. During this month, no death occurred due to this virus, indicating that the number of confirmed cases decreased compared to October. Meanwhile, **150** people made a recovery this month. The total number of confirmed cases has reached **2,046,079**, since the first identification of Covid-19 in Bangladesh in March 2020. According to the [DGHS](#), the total number of deaths by the end of November was **29,477**. See the details in [Annex1](#).



Dengue

Based on the DGHS daily situation report, the confirmed cases and deaths of Dengue decreased in November compared with October. In November, most of the districts suffered from dengue, and as usual, Dhaka had the highest number of confirmed cases (**9319**) and deaths (**127**). Secondly, the Chattogram district confirms cases (**2350**) and deaths (**3**). In November the total number of confirmed cases was **36,853** and a total of **277** people killed whereas in October both the number of confirmed cases and deaths were higher. In this month it spread to all **64** Districts of Bangladesh. See the details in [Annex2](#).

Fire

According to the [NDRCC](#) report and different dailies, **676** fire incidents took place across the country in November 2023. Dhaka division reported the highest number of fire incidents (**286**), followed by Khulna division (**100**) Chattogram division (**87**), Rajshahi division (**86**), Mymensingh (**35**), Rangpur division, (**30**), Sylhet division (**27**), Barishal Division (**18**). Among the **676** incidents, **1** person killed, **8** people were injured, **10** shops and several property damages were recorded. For more details, see [Annex3.1](#).

According to national dailies, In November 2023, various incidents were reported across different regions of Bangladesh. On November 1, Dhaka saw no apparent damage, according to Dhaka Tribune. On November 10, Dhaka again reported no casualties, as noted by Dhaka Tribune, while on the same day in Khulna, specifically in Rupsa, part of a jute mill warehouse was razed, as reported by Dhaka Tribune. Moving forward to November 15, Gazipur's Kaliakoir in Dhaka Division experienced no damage, according to Dhaka Tribune. On the same day, Keraniganj in Dhaka District also reported no damage, as stated by Prothom Alo. However, on November 16 in Chandina, Cumilla, under Chittagong Division, 10 shops were gutted, as reported by The Business Standard. Finally, on November 22 in Sylhet, seventeen seats of an AC compartment were completely burnt along with other damages to the carriage, as reported by The Daily Star. More details [Annex3.2](#).

Wall Collapse

In the early hours of November 17, 2023 tragedy struck in Teknaf, Cox's Bazar, when a mud wall collapsed in the Panirchhara area of Morichyaghona. The collapse claimed the lives of **four** family members residing at the foot of the hill. ([Prothomalo](#))

Cyclone

On November 17, 2023 Cyclone **Midhili** hit Bangladesh, resulting in significant loss of life and property damage. The cyclone caused widespread destruction, with reports indicating casualties and property damage in multiple districts. Tragically, **seven** lives were lost, including a family of four in Teknaf, Cox's Bazar, where their home collapsed due to the storm. Additionally, **two individuals** lost their lives in Chittagong, and **one** person killed in Tangail. The cyclone's impact extended beyond loss of life, causing extensive damage to property, including homes, crops, and infrastructure. Preliminary estimates suggest that nearly **94,577** people were affected, with **thousands of houses** partially or completely damaged. The agricultural sector also suffered mostly, with significant damage to rice crops and other agricultural products, further exacerbating the impact on livelihoods. As relief efforts continue, the need for comprehensive assessment and assistance in affected areas remains critical to aid in recovery and rebuilding efforts. ([Prothomalo](#))

Boat Capsize

On 19 November 2023, a boat named FB Tamanna capsized in the Bay of Bengal. **Fourteen** fishermen initially reported missing, were found alive, clinging to trees in the Sundarbans to avoid wild animal attacks. Despite the boat being completely lost, there were no reported deaths or injuries among the fishermen. They were able to make contact on the evening of 18 November and were scheduled to be rescued and brought to Patharghata the following day ([Somoynews. tv](#)).

GoB Response in November 2023

There are no reported Gov responses for all hazard incidences in November 2023.

Conclusion

A total of **six types** of hazards took place in November 2023 with multiple casualties of life and assets across the country. These incidents caused a huge loss of lives and properties and disrupted daily activities.
