








































## Overview of Hazard Incidences in January 2024

A total of **six** distinct hazard incidents occurred in Bangladesh during January 2024. These incidents included **COVID-19, Dengue, Boat Capsize, Fire incidents, Wall collapses, and Cold Wave**. In contrast to December 2023, there was a rise in the number of confirmed cases of Covid-19 cases and deaths that occurred during January 2024. There were **5** deaths reported during January along with **858** newly confirmed cases of COVID-19, according to [DGHS](#). Additionally, during the same month, **853** people recovered from the virus. There was a total of **656** fire incidents that were recorded and tragically, these fire incidents resulted in **6** fatalities and **5** injuries, as stated in the daily hazard situation report of the Department of Disaster Management ([DDM](#)), and the Daily Newspaper.

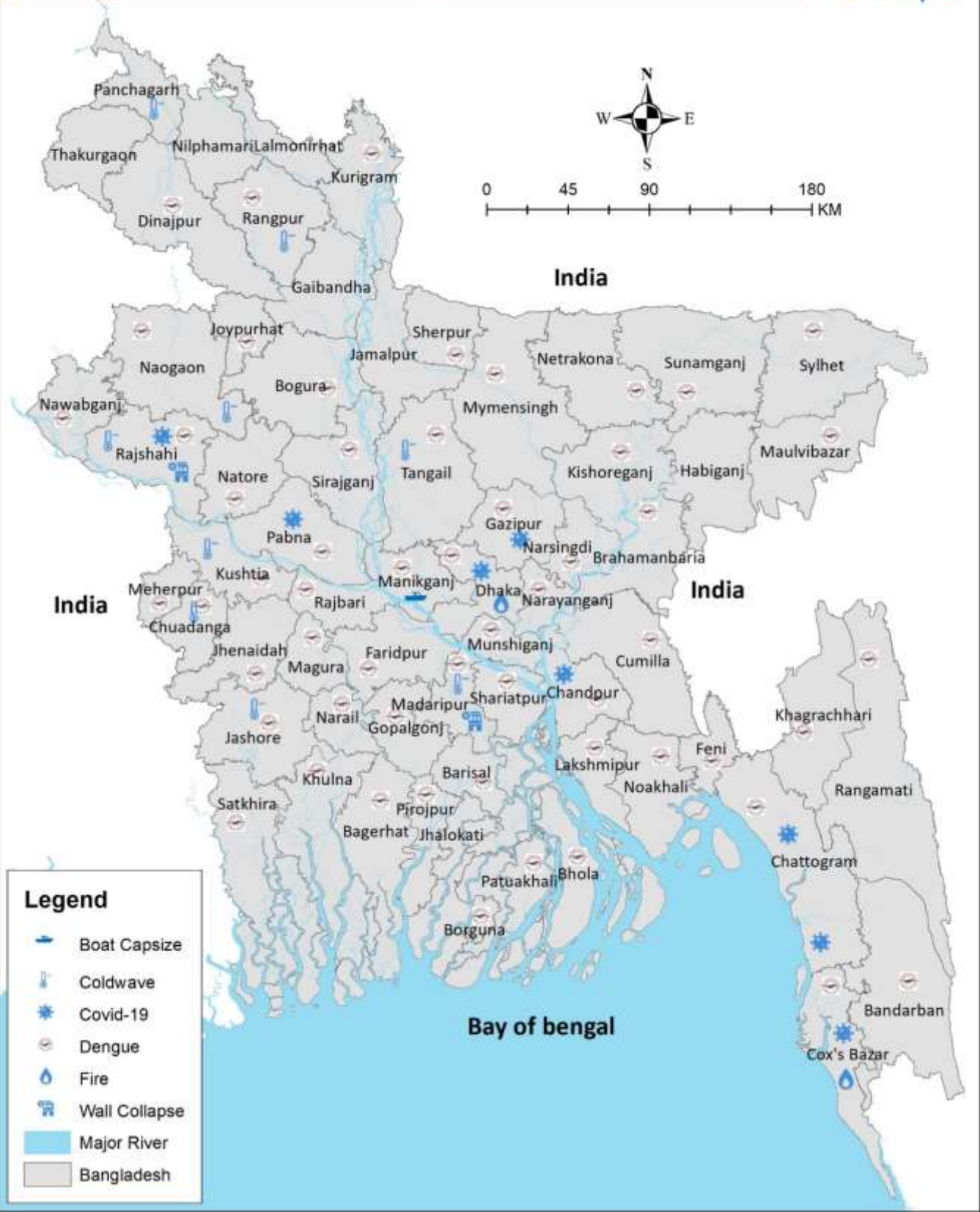
Moreover, there was a wall collapse that was witnessed, which resulted in the recording of **9** unfortunate deaths. In addition to that, one incident of boat capsizes occurred in Manikganj district where a ferry went underwater with trucks and pick-up vans. Both the number of Confirmed cases and deaths from Dengue saw a decrease in January 2024. As stated in the daily situation report provided by the Directorate General of Health Services ([DGHS](#)), the outbreak affected approximately **54** districts in Bangladesh, with a total of **1053** confirmed cases and **17** deaths reported during January.

Additionally, throughout January, the cold wave affected **18** districts, including regions in the Rangpur, Rajshahi, and Dhaka divisions, with Kishoreganj and Chuadanga also experiencing significant cold. In early January, Bangladesh experienced a challenging winter with a **mild cold wave** affecting various regions. Sreemangal in Moulvibazar recorded the lowest temperature at **9.7°C**. Tentulia in Panchagarh saw temperatures drop to **8.4°C**, indicating a mild cold wave. Earlier in the month, Chuadanga and Sirajganj experienced moderate cold waves with temperatures of **6.6°C**. Rajshahi, Pabna's Ishwardi, and Naogaon's Badalgachi also reported low temperatures of **9.5°C**. Dinajpur recorded **8.1°C** later in the month.

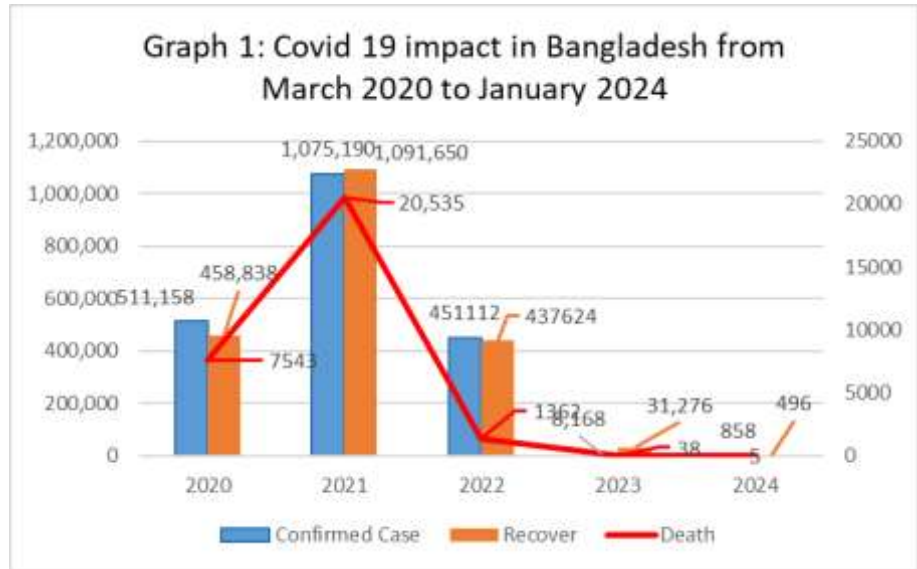
# Hazard Incidence in Bangladesh, January 2024



## Description of Hazard Incidences in January 2024

### Covid-19

Between the first of January and the last day of January 2024, 858 patients were newly identified with Covid-19. During this period, there have been 5 reported deaths and 496 people have made a full recovery. This indicates that there has been an increase in the number of confirmed cases as well as the number of deaths when compared to December 2023.



Since the initial identification of COVID-19, the total number of confirmed cases has reached **2,047,151** as of the end of January and the total number of deaths in Bangladesh was **29,482**, and the total number of cases that were recovered was **2,017,669** (DGHS). ### Dengue

Based on [DGHS](#) daily situation report, there was a decrease in confirmed cases and deaths of dengue compared to the previous month. In January, **54** districts of Bangladesh were affected by dengue, and **Dhaka** as usual recorded the highest number of confirmed cases (**368**) and deaths (**8**). There were **1053** confirmed cases and **17** reported deaths in total throughout January. The map shows the spatial distribution of dengue-confirmed cases in January. ### Fire

According to the Disaster Situation Report of the Department of Disaster Management ([DDM](#)), **654** fire incidents took place across the country in January 2024. Dhaka division reported the highest number of fire incidents (**168**), followed by Chattogram (**96**) Khulna division (**91**), Rajshahi division (**77**), Rangpur division (**24**), Mymensingh division (**71**), Sylhet division (**52**), Barisal Division (**26**). Out of the **654** recorded incidents, **2** and **5** injuries were reported, along with significant property damage. For deep information check [Annex3](#). On January 5, 2024, a devastating incident unfolded in Golapbagh, Dhaka, as the Benapole Express train was intentionally set on fire, resulting in the tragic loss of at least four lives, including two children, and leaving several others injured. Video footage captured the severity of the inferno, showing individuals trapped within the engulfed train carriages. Injured survivors were swiftly transported to hospitals, including the Sheikh Hasina National Institute of Burn and Plastic Surgery, for urgent medical treatment. ([The Daily Star](#)). On January 8, 2024, another devastating fire ravaged four blocks of the Kutupalong Rohingya camp in Cox's Bazar. Originating from a house in block A of camp No. 5, the fire rapidly spread, destroying over a thousand homes before Fire Service personnel managed to control it early the following morning. Thankfully, there were no reported casualties. ([The Financial Express](#)).

### Boat Capsize

On January 17, 2024, the second master of the ferry involved in the tragic sinking of Rajanigandha in the Padma River near Manikganj's Paturia was suspended. The ferry, along with nine pickup trucks and covered vans, capsized a week ago on the Daulatdia-Paturia route ([Dhaka Tribune](#)).

### **Cold Wave**

On January 19, 2024, Bangladesh experienced a continuing cold wave, with fog disrupting transport. The lowest temperature recorded was **9.7** degrees Celsius in Panchagarh's Tetulia. ([The Business Standard](#)). On January 22, 2024, a persistent cold wave impacted **21** districts, leading to delayed school start times. Temperatures fell to **8.1** degrees Celsius, primarily in Rangpur, Rajshahi, Tangail, Madaripur, Jashore, Chuadanga, and Kushtia. ([The Business Standard](#)). On January 24, 2024, a mild cold wave affected **18** districts of Bangladesh, including Rangpur, Rajshahi, Kishoreganj, and Chuadanga. Temperatures dropped to **8.4** degrees Celsius in Tentulia, Panchagarh, signaling cold weather. ([Prothom alo](#)).

### **Wall Collapse**

On January 30, 2024, a devastating event occurred at Rajshahi University when a section of the roof collapsed at the ongoing construction site of the 10-storey Shaheed AHM Kamaruzzaman Hall. This incident occurred at approximately 12:30 pm while nine workers were involved in casting the roof. Although the collapse resulted in injuries to at least nine laborers, there were no fatalities reported. The injured workers were quickly rescued and transported to Rajshahi Medical College Hospital for necessary medical attention. ([bdnews24](#)).

## **GoB Response in January 2024**

There is no GoB response for the hazard incidences in the month of January, 2024.

## **Conclusion**

In January 2024, Bangladesh faced different types of hazards and adverse events, and the report underscores the critical need for a robust disaster management strategy to mitigate the impact of adverse events. This underscores the need for an integrated and proactive approach to disaster risk reduction.
