## Description of the Hazard Incidences in September 2016

### **Fire**

In September, there are some notable fire incidents occurred. Among them the Tampaco Foils, which owns the five-storey factory, packages various items such as chips, mosquito coils etc. (Metro.co.uk, September, 11, 2016), was the most severe one. The factory building collapsed after explosions around 6:15 am Saturday. So far, 37 bodies have been recovered while many are still missing (The Dhaka Tribune, September 12). It was told the most dangerous industrial disaster after the Rana Plaza explosion of 2013.

### **Boat Capsize**

1 is dead in Gaforgaon upazila in Mymensing district on September 5 and 2 children died due to boat capsizing in Hijla upazila of Barisal on September 15. In September 21, 25 people died, including eight men, 10 women and 7 children and 9 others went missing due to launch capsizing at Banaripara of Barishal.

### **Riverbank Erosion**

At September 25, Houses are destroyed and local small shops, agricultural lands all are under water due to riverbank erosion at Monpura of Hazirghat upazila of Bhola (The Daily Jugantor, September 25).

## Lightning

In this month, there are four lightning occurrences have been reported on 18<sup>th</sup>, 19<sup>th</sup>, 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup>. The impacts are reported below.

## GOB Responses in September

**Response in Fire incidents:** Each family of the dead in fire incident is donated BDT 20,000 and BDT 10,000 per affected family (NDRCC report, September 12).

**Response in Lightning:** BDT 30,000 has been given to the family of each dead and DBT 5000 has been given to the injured family by MoDRM (NDRCC Report, September 21).

**Response in Launch Capsize:** Each family of the dead people are given BDT 10,000 by MoDRM (The Daily Star, 24 September and The Daily Jugantor, September 22).

## Conclusion

Disaster frequency was comparatively less in the month of September. But the impact of fire incident of Tongi, Gazipur was so devastating. As well, there were low intensity disasters in different parts of the country e.g. lightning, boat capsized, launch capsized. Amongst the disasters, the most severe one, fire incident of 11<sup>th</sup> September, was responded on priority basis by Government.
