


Overview of Hazard Incidences in August 2024

A total of 9 distinct hazard incidents occurred in Bangladesh during August 2024. These incidents included COVID-19, dengue, fire incidents, landslides, lightning, boat capsize, waterlogging, Embankment Collapse, and floods. According to NDRCC, floods affected 696,995 families and 5,457,702 people. The death toll due to flooding stands at 59 (41 men, 6 women, and 12 children), with one person missing in affected 11 districts (Feni, Comilla, Chittagong, Khagrachari, Noakhali, Moulvibazar, Habigani, Brahmanbaria, Sylhet, Lakshmipur, and Cox's Bazar) in the month of August. There was an increase in confirmed dengue cases and deaths compared to the previous month. In August, all 47 districts were affected by dengue, with Dhaka reporting the highest number of confirmed cases 3,339 and 20 deaths. In August, there were 7,128 confirmed cases and 26 deaths. In August 2024, different lightning incidents caused a total of nine fatalities occurred across four districts in Bangladesh Thakurgaon, Sherpur, Habigani, and Chattogram. Additionally, seven people were killed, and 19 others were injured in fire-related incidents across various regions. On the other hand, five individuals lost their lives due to landslides, including. Besides, based on the daily newspaper two children were killed, two others were injured, and two individuals are still missing as a result of boat capsize incidents. There were 72 newly confirmed cases of COVID-19 in August, with no death and 239 recoveries. the total number of confirmed cases has reached 20,51387 as of the end of August. By the end of August, the total number of deaths in Bangladesh was 29,499 and the total number of cases that were recovered was 20,19076 (DGHS). This represents a decrease in both cases and fatalities compared to previous months. Various areas experienced severe **waterlogging**, especially on roads, disrupting traffic and endangering drivers and passengers. Vehicles such as easy bikes and motorcycles struggled in these conditions. Lastly, an embankment collapse occurred in Pabna which disrupted communication in 14 villages, causing widespread distress.



Description of Hazard Incidences in August 2024

Covid-19

In August, 72 patients were newly identified with Covid-19. During this period, there have been no deaths reported and 293 people have made a full recovery. This indicates that there has been a decrease in the number of confirmed cases and the number of deaths compared to the previous month. Since the initial identification COVID-19. the total number confirmed cases has reached 20,51387 as of the end of August. By the end of August, the total number of deaths in Bangladesh was 29,499 and the total



number of cases that were recovered was 20,19076 (DGHS). Kindly refer to (Annex 1) to obtain a more comprehensive analysis.

Dengue

Based on the <u>DGHS</u> daily situation report, there was an increase in confirmed cases and deaths of dengue compared to the previous month. In August, all 47 districts of Bangladesh were affected by dengue, and Dhaka as usual recorded the highest number of confirmed cases (3339) and deaths (20). There were 7,128 confirmed cases and 26 reported deaths in total throughout June. For in-depth analysis, please refer to (Annex 2).

Fire

According to the Disaster Situation Report of the Ministry of Disaster Management and Relief (MoDMR), 379 fire incidents took place across the country in August 2024. Dhaka division reported the highest number of fire incidents (136), followed by Rajshahi division (68), Khulna division (49), Mymensingh (45), Rangpur (39), Chattogram (38), Sylhet division (3), Barishal division (01). For in-depth analysis, refer to (Annex 3).

On the other hand, according to the daily newspaper on August 21, 2024, a tragic incident occurred in Dhanmondi, Dhaka, where **three** people lost their lives (<u>Prothom Alo</u>).

Lightning

On August 11, 2024, lightning struck in Thakurgaon District, killing **two** females (aged 45 and 14) in Hossaingaon, Ranisankail, and **one** male (aged 30) in Aamgaon, Horipur, as reported by <u>Prothom Alo</u>. The next day, two men (aged 40 and 60) lost their lives due to lightning in Singabaruna, Sreebardi, Sherpur District. On August 13, 2024, lightning killed three men (aged 22, 25, and 55) in Bohra, Madhabpur, Habiganj District, <u>Prothom Alo</u>. On August 29, 2024, a fisherman (aged 50) died in Bashkhali, Chattogram District, as reported by <u>Samakal</u>, resulting in a total of nine lightning-related deaths across these locations (Annex 4).

Landslide

On August 18-19, 2024, landslides caused severe damage and disruption in Chattogram Division. On August 18, a landslide in Chokoria, Cox's Bazar, killed a mother and her **two** children when a large chunk of earth collapsed on their house <u>Prothom Alo</u>. On the same day, a road collapse in Rangamati disrupted transportation. The following day, a landslide in Moheshkhali, Cox's Bazar, claimed the life of a man, and another incident in Potiya, Chattogram, led to the death of a young girl. These landslides resulted in **five** deaths and considerable distress due to disruptions in the affected areas (<u>Annex 5</u>).

Waterlogging

on August 28, waterlogging in Dhaka's Nawabganj area caused distress, with drivers and passengers facing difficulties as roads became hazardous due to water accumulation, affecting the movement of vehicles like easy bikes and motorcycles <u>Samakal</u>.

Boat Capsize

On August 11, 2024, in Raninagar, Nagaon, a boat capsized, resulting in the tragic deaths of **two** children, while **two** others were injured, as reported by <u>Prothom alo</u>. On August 13, 2024, in Chandpur, Chattogram division, two people were reported missing, according to the same source <u>Prothom alo</u>.

Flood

Currently, 11 districts in Bangladesh are affected by flooding, including Feni, Comilla, Chittagong, Khagrachari, Noakhali, Moulvibazar, Habiganj, Brahmanbaria, Sylhet, Lakshmipur, and Cox's Bazar. The flood situation in Chittagong, Khagrachari, Cox's Bazar, Habiganj, and Sylhet has returned to normal, while the conditions in Moulvibazar and Brahmanbaria have significantly improved. However, Comilla, Feni, Noakhali, and Lakshmipur are still experiencing gradual improvements. The floods have severely impacted 68 upazilas and 504 unions/municipalities, affecting a total of 696,995 families and a population of 5,457,702. Tragically, the death toll stands at 59, including 41 men, six women, and 12 children, with one person still reported missing NDRCC.

Embankment Collapse

On August 21, 2024, in Ishawganj, Pabna, an embankment collapses disrupted communication in 14 villages, causing significant distressProthom alo.

GoB Response in August 2024

Flood

In response to the floods, 3,928 shelters have been opened, providing shelter to **393,305** people and **36,159** livestock. Additionally, 519 medical teams are operating in the affected districts, offering essential healthcare services. Coordinated relief efforts are underway to ensure that aid reaches remote areas. The armed forces have played a critical role, distributing 236,328 packets of dry food and 20,410 packets of cooked food. They have also rescued 42,816 people, provided medical assistance to 23,570 individuals, and performed 153 rescues using helicopters. A total of 24 camps and 18 medical teams are actively delivering healthcare and essential supplies, such as drinking water, water purification tablets, clothing, medicines, baby food, and sanitary items NDRCC.

Conclusion

Bangladesh experienced a variety of hazardous event occurrences in August 2024; the study emphasizes the need for a disaster management plan to lessen the effects of these events. This emphasizes the necessity of catastrophe risk mitigation through an integrated and proactive approach.
